# APPENDIX B <u>District Councillor's Report 02<sup>nd</sup> July 2019 to Sturmer Parish Council (Cllr. Diana Garrod - Bumpstead Ward)</u>

### Steeple Bumpstead Surgery Update as at 01.07.19

I attended a meeting in Steeple Bumpstead on 10<sup>th</sup> June. The GP surgery in Steeple Bumpstead is a relatively small practice and is struggling to provide consistent General Practice services, due mainly to staffing issues. This has resulted in a poor rating by the Care Quality Commission (CQC). Provide (who run the service) and West Essex CCG (who commission the service) are taking action to redress the situation. It has to be stressed that patient safety has not been compromised and is being closely monitored.

I attended a further meeting on 1<sup>st</sup> July. Whilst Provide still hold the contract, Uttlesford Health started at the surgery on 17<sup>th</sup> June and all is going well. The CCG are currently in discussion with interested parties, which sounds quite positive but it is very early days. A further meeting is scheduled for early August.

#### Fly-Tipping

Braintree District Council was successful in taking legal action against Sarah Dunbar, age 33 from Witham for the failure in duty of care of her waste, paying an unknown person to take waste from her property.



This waste was then found fly tipped in a lay-by between Coggeshall and Feering. Ms Dunbar was given adequate time to provide details of this person, but failed to do so. This case was heard in the Colchester Magistrates Court on Thursday 6th June 2019. Ms Dunbar pleaded not guilty to the offence, however after obtaining legal advice, changed her plea to guilty. Ms Dunbar was fined, had to pay a victim surcharge and pay costs to Braintree District Council - a total of £758.
