Community 360 News – Funding for Churches and Christian Charities to Respond to Coronavirus Crisis

Churches, cathedrals and Christian denominational bodies, and Christian charities in the UK and the Republic of Ireland can now apply for funding to meet changing needs within their communities as the longer-term impact of the coronavirus/COVID-19 crisis becomes clearer. Horizon 120 Business & Innovation Park is set to receive £7m Government Funding

BDC is set to receive £7million from the government's Getting Building Fund to create an enterprise centre on the new Horizon 120 Business and Innovation Park which will create at least 150 new jobs a year. The new enterprise centre is 1 of 34 projects across the South East region which will receive a share of the £85 million allocated to the South East Local Enterprise Partnership. The building work on the new enterprise centre is expected to start early next year. The creation of this centre will be in addition to the new hub for construction innovation (I-Construct) soon to be built on the Springwood industrial estate. It will be a great boost for the new Horizon 120 Business and Innovation Park

Contacting Essex Police

A number of new features have been introduced on the Essex Police website. It now has live chat which runs between 7am and 11pm and enables you to text-chat an operator live online. There are also a number of reporting forms which you can use to log incidents of crime, antisocial behaviour or any information you want to make police aware of. These services are for use when your contact with Essex Police does not involve an emergency. It may be easier and quicker for you to contact police via the website rather than phoning 101. In an emergency please always dial 999. Call takers will prioritise calls to the 999 service but please only use the emergency number in a genuine emergency – your call could be preventing Essex Police getting to someone in real trouble if not

Local Plan Update – Housing Projection Figures

Residents across North Essex are being given the chance to have their say on the proposed changes to the joint parts of the local plans for Braintree, Colchester and Tendring made by the Planning Inspector. The Inspector recommended some key modifications to the proposals and people will be able to comment during a six week consultation running from 27/08/20 to 09/10/20. This consultation is only on the proposed main modifications. Any consultation on the NEA's position on the impact of the Office for National Statistics: 2018-based household projections would be carried out during a separate process at the request of the Inspector.

Cllr Gabrielle Spray, Cabinet Member for Planning at Braintree District Council said: "This is the final chance for the public to have their say on Section One of our Local Plan, and we welcome people's comments on the Planning Inspector's proposals".

Job Retention Bonus

The government is introducing a new Job Retention Bonus to provide additional support to employers who keep on their furloughed employees in meaningful employment, after the government's Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme ends on 31 October 2020. The Job Retention Bonus is a one-off payment to employers of £1,000 for every employee who they previously claimed for under the scheme, and who remains continuously employed through to 31 January 2021. Eligible employees must earn at least £520 a month on average between the 1 November 2020 and 31 January 2021. Employers will be able to claim the Job Retention Bonus after they have filed PAYE for January and payments will be made to employers from February 2021. Covid-19: Self-isolation period to be increased to 10 days

The government has announced that anyone in the UK experiencing coronavirus symptoms or who has tested positive for the virus will now have to self-isolate for ten days rather than seven days. The Health Secretary advised this measure has been put in place in reaction to a perceived second wave of coronavirus 'coming across Europe' and in an attempt to prevent similar spikes in the UK. This advice will apply to anyone currently self-isolating as a result of covid-19 symptoms and those already part way through their seven-day isolation will need to ensure they self-isolate for the full ten days. Government advice remains that anyone experiencing symptoms should be tested and then follow appropriate medical advice.

Business Grants Update

More than 2,600 firms in the Braintree District have benefitted from over £30 million in business grants since the Government's financial support measures began as a result of the coronavirus (COVID-19) crisis. Braintree District Council distributed the emergency grants from monies received from central Government to provide relief for businesses impacted by the pandemic. Grants ranging from £2,000 to £25,000 from three different grant schemes* have been issued to support businesses across a number of sectors over the past five months.

Local Road Closures

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14(1) – Temporary Traffic Regulation Orders:

Intended closure of Water Lane, Kedington Road, Sturmer due to commence on 23rd November 2020 for 12 days. The closure is required for the safety of the public and workforce while Essex County Council undertakes investigation works, core holes and trial holes.

Specialist Counselling Service for Children & Young People

A new service has launched to support children and young people aged 5-18 years (or up to 25 if in receipt of an Education, Health and Care Plan) in response to COVID-19 and an increase in demand for mental health support. The specialist early intervention service will support children and young people with emerging mental health issues living in Mid-Essex, Castle Point and Rochford and Southend. It can provide support with:

- low level depression
- anxiety
- low mood
- worries and concerns arising from Covid-19
