APPENDIX A

Parish Councillors discussed the following and wish to object to proposals contained in 23/01083/FUL for the following reasons:-

The application site is not listed in the Braintree District Council Local Plan.

The application site is located outside Sturmer village defined development boundary (village envelope) and lies within the countryside, which is also part of the Dedham Vale AONB and Stour Valley 'project area' and is considered a 'valued landscape'.

The proposed access would be unacceptably detrimental to Hill Lane, which is a 'Protected Lane', is primarily a single track lane with insufficient passing places for traffic. The junction at Hill Lane/A1017 is 'precarious' and drivers need to be cautious when accessing and exiting Hill Lane due to the obstructed visibility. The loss of hedgerow along Hill Lane for vehicles would be detrimental to the valued countryside setting and existing wildlife habitats.

Sturmer Parish Council and individual residents have raised concerns with Essex County Council regularly in relation to Hill Lane for over 25 years. The existing drainage system is not able to cope with current water flow. Torrents of water flow down Hill Lane and pool on the A1017 causing traffic issues and queues in times of flash flooding or long periods of rainfall. It was the subject of a meeting with Essex County Council Highways in November 2022, and has yet to be resolved.

Water emanating from the proposed site causes flooding to the gardens of dwellings from the corner of Hill Lane (Churdles), along the A1017 to Maltings Cottages. Flood protection measures such as woody dams and mole drainage have been undertaken, but remains insufficient during excessive rainfall.
